Student Filmmakers Selected for Next Round of “Directing Change” Competition: A total of 371 Public Service Announcement submissions to prevent suicide and change minds about mental illness were received, representing 922 students from 35 counties. Regional winners of the statewide “Directing Change” student video contest have been selected to move onto the second, statewide round of judging. Entries were judged by volunteer experts in mental health and suicide prevention, members of the media and professionals in filmmaking and video production. Regional contest winners come from Butte, Contra Costa, El Dorado, Fresno, Inyo, Los Angeles, Marin, Monterey, Napa, Orange, Placer, Riverside, Sacramento, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara, Solano, Sonoma, Tulare, and Yolo counties. Statewide contest winners will be announced in an award ceremony May 23rd, 2013 at the Crest Theater in Sacramento featuring director Bradley Buecker and actor Max Adler, who plays “Dave Karofsky” from Fox’s hit TV series Glee. Student Mental Health Policy Workgroup’s Curriculum Recommendation Endorsed by CalMHSA: At their April 12, 2013 meeting, CalMHSA’s Board of Directors endorsed the Student Mental Health Policy Workgroup’s recommendation that “the State Superintendent of Public Instruction request that appropriate credentialing

programs(starting with multiple/single-subject and administrative services credentials) include mental health and wellness curricula with information about mental health conditions and how they manifest at school.” Policy recommendations made by the Workgroup are intended to help educators identify, reach, and teach students affected by mental health conditions and promote school environments and strategies that improve the learning environment. New esuicideTALK tool available to Counties: *As part of the CalMHSa Suicide Prevention Training Workforce Enhancement Program, a new online suicide awareness tool is available to counties from LivingWorks Education. The esuicideTALK program aims to build awareness of suicide and introduces activities that can make an individual or someone they care about safer. esuicideTALK is available for anyone within a community ages 15 and up. Up to 16,100 individual user licenses for esuicideTALK will be distributed primarily by the three CalMHSa Suicide Prevention Training Coordinators.
