# B. Sustainability Task Force - PEI Statewide Project - FY 18/19 Contracts

Dr. William Arroyo, Los Angeles County, did a review of the presentation for Fiscal Year 2018/2019 PEI contracting and budget, to include general scopes of work for contractors. Dr. Arroyo also shared that RAND (evaluator) would be coming out with a report in a national publication indicating Active Minds is improving mental health in higher education.

Action: Approved contract funding for continued implementation of the Phase III Statewide PEI Project in FY 18/19 with the existing contractors in the amounts stated in the staff report, delegate authority to the Sustainability Taskforce to direct staff on allocation of up to \$2 million in additional funds to the same contractors for similar services if funds become available, and authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and execute contract extensions or amendments to implement the approved funding.

# C. State Hospital Bed Update

CalMHSA Chief Operating Officer, John Chaquica, introduced an update on the State Hospital Program and the need to have counties complete the Amendment to the MOU. He described the Letter of Intent to be considered for action, letting Board Members know that no commitments or money is needed now, and stated that CalMHSA is still in conversation with the City of Paso Robles. Mr. Chaquica discussed the deposit amount, initially estimated at \$250,000, however reduced to \$100,000, and the allocations in the packet could also be reduced given there is interest from additional counties.

The State Hospital Committee has been involved in the development of the packet, which has been sent to Behavioral Health Directors. The Committee has been asked to start internal conversations with their Boards, given their level of interest. This initial deposit amount of \$100,000 is to demonstrate our commitment to the City of Paso Robles which will further their negotiation power with the State in procurement of the property.

# SUBJECT: STATE HOSPITALS PROGRAM UPDATE

# **ACTION FOR CONSIDERATION:**

Approval to continue negotiations with the City of Paso Robles and Correct Care Recovery Solutions.

# **BACKGROUND AND STATUS:**

At the April 23, 2012, Strategic Planning Session, staff was asked to work with CBHDA in exploring the JPA acting on behalf of member counties in the negotiations of the annual procurement contract with the state for state hospital beds.

Since 2012, CalMHSA, in collaboration with counties, has negotiated the terms of the MOU for procurement of state hospital beds, which has attributed to significant benefits to all counties procuring beds.

Due to the FY 14/15 & FY 15/16 MOU being finalized late, CalMHSA recommended an Amendment to the MOU be issued that extends the term for an additional three (3) years through June 30, 2019. This extension will only affect the term of the contract, as all other terms remain in effect.

To date, CalMHSA has received executed MOUs from a majority of member counties for FY 2018-19 while collecting those still in process.

# **DSH - CalMHSA Meeting**

On August 24, 2018, CalMHSA, joined by Los Angeles and Riverside Counties, had a meeting with the state department to continue collaborative efforts in improving admissions and discharge processes, reducing waitlists and streamlining shared information via a secure site. In addition, the department indicated going through a major transition period which includes the hiring of Public Consulting Group out of Sacramento to perform a department wide audit. The audit is to include assessment of services provided and fees for service at each hospital. The audit is expected to start October/November with and outcomes report by late December. It is anticipated that the outcomes report will include "actual costs for services" therefore the department will be looking to increase rates for the new contract period.

As it relates to the contractual document, the department has determined that moving forward they would not be using an MOU however will be using their new full contract template. It was agreed that the parties could commence negotiating the terms of the full agreement now and will address the rates in January upon receiving the outcomes report with their proposed new rates.

CalMHSA continues to have conversations with the department related to the impact of those counties acting separately and what those contract terms may be, as there should be no references or exposures to CalMHSA.

Moving forward and in acknowledgment of the limited resources all agreed to a reduced number of in-person meetings with more teleconference meetings, with the first meeting to take place in November. Date to be determined.

# **Alternative to State Hospitals:**

A State Hospital Committee was later formed, of which on December 12, 2013, determined there was a need to seek alternatives to state hospitals. As such, three proposals were submitted with Correct Care Recovery Solutions (CCRS) having been selected as the lead entity to guide us in this venture. In addition, on August 13, 2015 the CalMHSA Board approved proceeding with CCRS through and MOU in seeking alternatives to state hospitals.

Commitment – In light of, the work being done with CCRS for state hospital type services, CalMHSA staff initiated conversations with counties as to the level of financial commitment anticipated in order to secure alternatives to state hospital beds. As part of this discussion, staff has distributed a survey to counties to gauge the potential utilization of sites in both Paso Robles. To date, nine (9) counties have responded indicating their interest, as well as additional service types/models that counties might like. Counties are encouraged to initiate internal/local discussions related to the need and demand, followed by the level of commitment, and provide any relevant information to CalMHSA to guide the development of the project.

CalMHSA staff and CCRS (and strategic partners Cannon and Plenary) have had several internal meetings and three meetings with the City and site. The City continues its receptiveness and welcoming of CalMHSA's intent for a facility for LPS beds. They are looking at a mixed-use approach serving the Central Coast and Southern Counties. The City is still going through the process of renegotiating that price. As such, we do not have cost of leasing at this time.

The City desires to take ownership as soon as possible and are fully prepared to acquire the site as their funding is in place.

Effective July 3, 2018, the City of Paso Robles and CalMHSA executed the attached Letter of Intent.

# **Interested County Members Commitment**

Commitment amounts are based on a projected initial deposit of \$120,000 for 250-bed facility. This deposit is two-fold to demonstrate interest and to have funds available for design in the event the transaction does not go through after commitment made:

Los Angeles (200 LPS): \$79,797.30 Riverside (45 LPS): \$18,243.24

Alameda (10 LPS): **\$4,054.05** San Diego (10 LPS): **\$4,054.05** 

Contra Costa (10 LPS): **\$4,054.05** Santa Barbara (3 LPS): **\$2,500** 

Monterey (8 LPS): \$3,243.24 Stanislaus (10 LPS): \$4,054.05

On September 5, 2018, CalMHSA staff, CCRS, The Plenary Group and Los Angeles County

Department of Mental Health convened via teleconference to discuss the financial structure options

and discern LA's commitment level in the Paso Robles site. As a result of this teleconference, LA confirmed their interest in the site and agreed that regular meetings are to take place in the next couple of weeks to work through the details of the financial structure.

At this time, CalMHSA is acting as the lead agency in working through the timeline attached, with the intention of submitting the final LOI after the November Board Meeting. Commitment by individual county members will most likely be required between September and November 2018. The deposit above will be invoiced at the appropriate time (forecasted to be in October) in order for counties to appropriate funds. All deposits will be kept until and if there is further direction by CalMHSA.

With the proposed LOI being accepted, CalMHSA will began immediately working with Correct Care, Counsel, and the City on due diligence, negotiations, and agreements. CCRS, Cannon and Plenary will be presenting at the meeting to discuss and update the progress and key deal points.

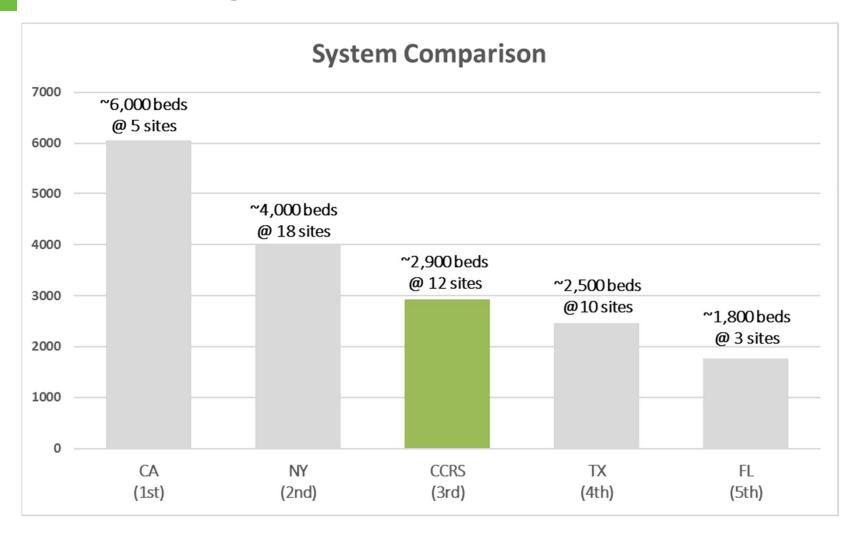

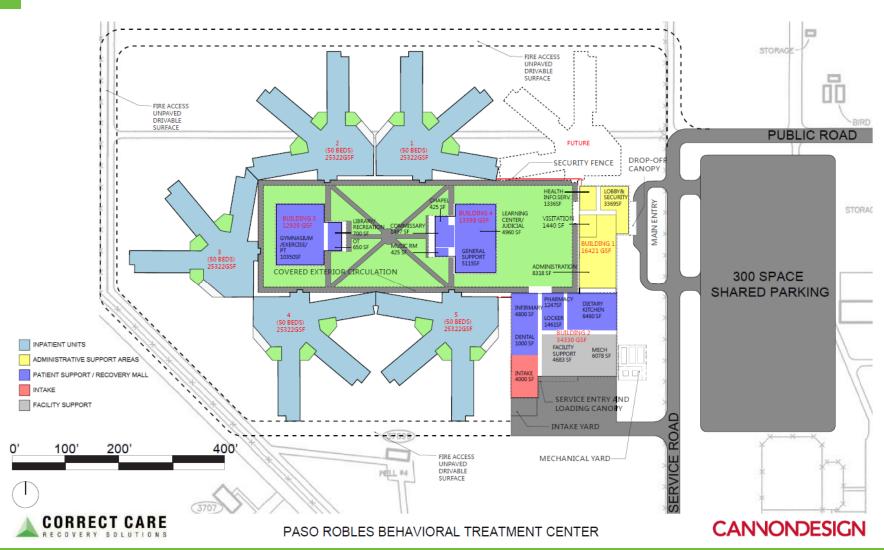

### **SUBJECT: INNOVATION TECH UPDATE**

#### **ACTION FOR CONSIDERATION:**

None, information only.

### **BACKGROUND AND STATUS:**

The Board of Directors approved CalMHSA to administer the Innovation Technology Suite Project on behalf of individual CalMHSA members during the October 12, 2017, Board Meeting. Currently five counties have received Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC) approval and hold Participation Agreements with CalMHSA: Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Modoc County, and Mono County.

CalMHSA and participating counties have chosen four initial vendors through competitive processes (RFP and RFSQ) to begin development and implementation:

- 1. 7 Cups: Application
- 2. Mindstrong: Application
- 3. University of California, Irvine: Evaluation
- 4. Runyon Saltzman & Einhorn, Inc.: Outreach and Marketing

CalMHSA has contracted for additional project support with:

- 1. CIBHS: Karin Kalk, Project Manager, and Samantha Spangler, Evaluation Expert
- 2. Intrepid Ascent: Implementation Support
- 3. Nancy Peña: Implementation Support

On September 27, 2018, eight additional counties and two cities will present plans to the MHSOAC to join the Innovation Technology Suite. Those counties include Inyo County, Riverside County, Tri-City Mental Health, Marin County, San Mateo County, the City of Berkeley, Tehama County, Monterey County, San Francisco City and County, and Santa Barbara County. Karin Kalk, Project Manager, has been in communication with the eight counties and two cities to support proposal development, finalize budgets, and plan for scalability of the project.

The Tech Suite Project launched in July 2018. CalMHSA is currently recruiting for the Technology Suite Peer and Community Engagement Manager while counties have or are in the process of hiring local peers.

The Tech Suite Project budget for the initial five counties is \$54 million. The additional counties and cities, if approved, will add an additional \$32 million to the budget, bringing the total to \$86 million. Note that CalMHSA's administrative fee for this project remains at 5%; it is currently \$2.7 million and will increase to \$4.3 million if additional counties are approved.

## SUBJECT: STRATEGIC PLANNING SESSION VISIONING PRIORITIES UPDATE

#### **ACTION FOR CONSIDERATION:**

Adopt Strategic Planning Area Priorities and delegate CalMHSA Staff to develop a workplan and budget for the priorities.

#### **BACKGROUND AND STATUS:**

The CalMHSA Board of Directors held a Strategic Planning and Visioning Session on April 11, 2018, following the CalMHSA Board Meeting. Members were asked to identify future priorities and projects for CalMHSA. The input provided by Board Members was collected and a summary document was provided to members on April 12, 2018. Again, on April 12<sup>th</sup>, members were requested to provide feedback or clarification to the summary document so that the CalMHSA Board could use these initial findings to further define strategic priorities for CalMHSA. From that feedback, CalMHSA Staff further refined the key visioning into five key areas. These areas are as follows:

### 1) Serve as the Communication Hub:

- Arrange for Media campaigns
- Facilitate Public awareness

# 2) Provide broader administrative/organizational support for greater efficiency for members, examples mentioned by members included the following:

- Organize and provide resources which benefit all members
- Retain experts for compliance issues in areas such as network adequacy, or triennial reviews
- Coordinate and consolidate responses to legal issues germane to all or a group of counties such as DHCS disallowances
- Serve as additional support for small counties on non-routine tasks where resources are not available such as the recent Blue Sky Report
- Evaluate the potential for consolidation or regionalization of projects currently performed by counties
- Create a menu of services which may include but is not limited to: legal, financial, contractual administrative services, grant writers, experts, trainers
- 3) Facilitate greater use of Regional administrative activities such as grant applications, service delivery systems, multi county data collection, financial transactions, quality management practices, and other joint county efforts:
  - Explore other State models for rural regional oversight and programming

- Pilot rural and urban population shared benefit activities
- Exploring ideas to address regional needs

## 4) Engage in additional Statewide Behavioral Health Prevention and treatment

- Expand and increase Mental Health promotion, prevention, and early intervention projects, across the life span
- Establish uniform practices for judicial, social service, and education partners
- Research need and feasibility of a small county risk pool for IMD or state hospital placement, and impact of IST efforts
- Act as resource for and coordinator for disaster response and mutual aid
- Research broader application of 16 bed MHRC for federal reimbursement

During July and August, members of the CalMHSA Executive Committee were surveyed to provide further guidance on the priorities shown above. Executive Committee members consistently identified the following priorities:

# 1) Serve as the Communication Hub.

- Statewide media campaigns public awareness
- Media campaigns that highlight the California Behavioral Health Directors Association priorities
- Utilizing Subject Matters Experts to support development of media campaigns
- Developing spokesperson toolkits that would be available to Counties for easy "off the shelf" implementation and consistency in media message response across all counties
- Customizable to not compete with locally designed and operated County media campaigns

# 2) Provide broader administrative/organizational support for greater efficiency.

- Develop a menu of services that counties could contract for depending on countyidentified need and infrastructure capacity limitations
- 3) Facilitate greater use of Regional administrative activities such as grant applications, service delivery systems, multi-county data collection, financial transactions, quality management practices, and other joint county efforts.
  - Regional implementation as identified by counties. Similar to current CalMHSA Administrative projects that are regional and multi-county.

Executive Committee Members also noted CalMHSA's role in acting jointly for efficient and effective county actions and statewide projects.

Next steps are to bring this feedback to CalMHSA Board members and seek further direction from the members.

  - b. Facilitate Public awareness announcements, (similar to above process), for example:
    - i. Education and advocacy for target populations/ issues; for instance BH media spots for waiting rooms in collaborating agencies
    - ii. Disseminate research findings
    - iii. Inform colleagues in law enforcement, social service, education, health
    - iv. Reach lawmakers and policy makers
