Roll Call	We encountered some issues with our zoom link, which hindered some participants from joining our meeting.
	We asked the Stakeholder Advisory Council members to type in their name and county in the Zoom chat to indicate their attendance.
Housekeeping	We reviewed the ways to raise your hand once called on, how to mute/un-mute yourself when dialed in by phone. We also provided information regarding Spanish interpretation and live transcripts. Also, we reminded everyone to use the Q&A feature so that their questions will be recording in the notes. We also gave everyone the reminder to speak for a maximum of one minute during public comment to ensure everyone has a chance to speak.

Data Snapshots	 As of March 15th, 2023, the Peer Certification Program has garnered 3,222 applications.
	 The majority, 60%, of these applicants have taken the Initial Certification Path, while the remaining 40%



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	 have opted for the Grandparenting Path. Currently, 534 applicants have received certification for Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialists.
Best Practices Guidelines	CAMHPRO presented the proposed outline for the guide. CalMHSA is seeking input/feedback/recommendations to ensure the guide contains the necessary information. The council members stated a career ladder and employment advancement should be included. Stakeholders also want the workplace to integrate Peers and to match peers with the same lived experience as themselves and to make a distinction between Peer to Peer and Parent Peer to Parent Peer. The stakeholders also displayed an interest in a workplace readiness checklist. Stakeholders also want to ensure that certification is NOT the only pathway for Peers.
Public Comment	The community advocated for financial aid for peers looking for training. A community member asked if a peer run organization has to have a county affiliation to be able to have a Peer Support Specialist as part of their staff with the ability to bill Medi-Cal. Another comment by the community stated that organizations should hire Peers and help them through the Peer Certification process. Feedback was received regarding the Certificant Registry, CalMHSA should include the ability to search for a certified peer by county. Feedback was also given regarding scholarship slots, CalMHSA needs to post on their website that CalMHSA is awarding scholarship opportunities to the public.
